Rekohu Sunrise

TRIFIDA



This first-ever variegated form of *Carex trifida* is named 'Rekohu Sunrise' in reference to where it was found - Chatham Island, also known as Rekohu by the Mori people who made this remote Southern Pacific island their home around 900 years ago. Rekohu means 'misty rain', for the island is often covered in low cloud and misty conditions. *Carex* 'Rekohu Sunrise' forms a large fountain-shaped, evergreen clump of broad green leaves with gold margins. Chestnut coloured flower spikes appear in spring to early summer and persist well into autumn. Being a sedge, 'Rekohu Sunrise' revels in damp soil, but is tolerant of a wide range of conditions, including extreme coastal locations. Full sun is preferable. *Carex* 'Rekohu Sunrise' is ideal for mass planting on exposed coastal sites or damp soils, adding colour highlights to a garden border, and makes the perfect centrepiece for a mixed container.
